Nichiren (￼; born as Zen-nichi-marō (￼), Dharma name: Rencho, 16 February 1222 ￼ 13 October 1282) was a Japanese Buddhist priest of the Kamakura period (1185￼1333), who developed the teachings of Nichiren Buddhism, a branch school of Mahayana Buddhism.

Nichiren believed that the quintessence of the Buddha ￼s teachings is contained in the Lotus Sutra (Sanskrit: Saddharmapundarika-sutra; ￼The Scripture of the Lotus of the Good Law￼). According to him, the other sects then existing in Japan misunderstood the truth, and he vehemently denounced them and the government that supported them.

Nichiren Buddhism is a form of Buddhism from Japan that emphasizes repeated recitation of the mantra namu myoho renge kyo ("salutation to the Lotus Sutra") for health, happiness and enlightenment. Nichiren Buddhists believe it is possible to attain enlightenment in a single lifetime through practice of "True Buddhism" (i.e., Nichiren).

Nichiren Shōnin (1222-1282), the founder of Nichiren Shū (the Nichiren School) was a Buddhist monk in 13th century Japan. Nichiren Shōnin sought to find the quintessence of the Buddha￼s teachings.
